- WHEREAS, Approximately 4 million Americans 1 in 10 persons over age 65
- 8 and nearly half of those over age 85, as well as a small percentage of people in their
- 9 40's and 50's have Alzheimer's disease; and
- WHEREAS, In a 1993 national survey 19 million Americans say they have a
- 11 family member with Alzheimer's disease, and 37 million know someone with

- WHEREAS, 70,000 Maryland residents have Alzheimer's disease or a related
