A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

## 2 Weinberg Center for the Arts Loan of 1989

- 3 FOR the purpose of amending Chapter 162 of the Acts of the General Assembly of
- 4 1989, the Weinberg Center for the Arts Loan of 1989, as amended by Chapter
- 5 205 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1995, to alter the nature of the
- 6 easement conveyed to the Maryland Historical Trust.
- 7 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,
- 8 Chapter 162 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1989, as amended by
- 9 Chapter 205 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1995
- 10 Section 1
- 11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 12 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 13 Chapter 162 of the Acts of 1989, as amended by Chapter 205 of the Acts of 1995
- 15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 16 MARYLAND, That:
- 17 (1) The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on
- 18 behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the Weinberg
- 19 Center for the Arts Loan of 1989 in the total principal amount of \$150,000. This loan
- 20 shall be evidenced by the issuance, sale, and delivery of State general obligation
- 21 bonds authorized by a resolution of the Board of Public Works and issued, sold, and
- 22 delivered in accordance with §§ 8-117 through 8-124 of the State Finance and
- 23 Procurement Article and Article 31, § 22 of the Code.
- 24 (2) The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan may be sold as
- 25 a single issue or may be consolidated and sold as part of a single issue of bonds under
- 26 § 8-122 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.
- 27 (3) The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the Treasurer
- 28 and first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling, and
- 29 delivering the bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and then

- 1 shall be credited on the books of the Comptroller and expended, on approval by the
- 2 Board of Public Works, for the following public purposes, including any applicable
- 3 architects' and engineers' fees: as a grant to the City of Frederick for the purpose of
- 4 improving and equipping the interior of the Weinberg Center for the Arts in the City
- 5 of Frederick, Frederick County.
- 6 (4) An annual State tax is imposed on all assessable property in the State in
- 7 rate and amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds, as and
- 8 when due and until paid in full. The principal shall be discharged within 15 years
- 9 after the date of issue of the bonds.
- 10 (5) Prior to the payment of any funds under the provisions of this Act for the
- 11 purposes set forth in Section 1(3) above, the City of Frederick shall provide at least an
- 12 equal and matching fund of \$150,000. No part of an applicant's matching fund may be
- 13 provided, either directly or indirectly, from funds of the State, whether appropriated
- 14 or unappropriated. No part of the fund may consist of real property, in kind
- 15 contributions, or funds expended prior to the effective date of this Act. In case of any
- 16 dispute as to what money or assets may qualify as matching funds, the Board of
- 17 Public Works shall determine the matter, and the Board's decision is final. The City of
- 18 Frederick has until June 1, 1991 to present evidence satisfactory to the Board of
- 19 Public Works that the matching fund will be provided. If satisfactory evidence is
- 20 presented, the Board shall certify this fact to the State Treasurer and the proceeds of
- 21 the loan shall be expended for the purposes provided in this Act. If this evidence is not
- 22 presented by June 1, 1991, the proceeds of the loan shall be applied to the purposes
- 23 authorized in § 8-129 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.
- 24 (6) (a) Prior to the issuance of the bonds, the Weinberg Center for the Arts
- 25 shall grant and convey to the Maryland Historical Trust a [perpetual] preservation
- 26 easement to the extent of its interest:
- 27 (i) On the land or such portion of the land acceptable to the Trust;
- 28 and
- 29 (ii) On the exterior and interior, where appropriate, of the historic
- 30 structures.
- 31 (b) The easement must be in form and substance acceptable to the Trust
- 32 and the extent of the interest to be encumbered must be acceptable to the Trust.
- 33 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take
- 34 effect June 1, 1998.
