

- 28 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 29 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

1 **Article - State Personnel and Pensions** 2 26-201. 3 (a) Except as provided in subsections (b) [and (c)] THROUGH (D) of this section, this subtitle applies only to: 5 an employee of the Department of Natural Resources commissioned (1) 6 by the Secretary of Natural Resources as: 7 (i) a Natural Resources police officer; or 8 (ii) a law enforcement officer, other than a Natural Resources police 9 officer; 10 (2) a law enforcement officer employed by the Maryland Investigative 11 Services Unit: 12 a member of the Maryland Transportation Authority Police Force 13 who has the powers granted to a police officer under § 4-208 of the Transportation 14 Article; or 15 a deputy sheriff employed by the Baltimore City Sheriff's (4) 16 Department. 17 (b) This subtitle does not apply to a Maryland Transportation Authority police 18 officer who transferred from the Employees' Retirement System to the Employees' 19 Pension System on or after December 1, 1996. This subtitle does not apply to a deputy sheriff employed by the Baltimore 20 (c) 21 City Sheriff's Department who transferred from the Employees' Retirement System 22 to the Employees' Pension System on or after December 1, 1996. 23 (D) THIS SUBTITLE DOES NOT APPLY TO A MARYLAND PORT ADMINISTRATION 24 POLICE OFFICER WHO TRANSFERRED FROM THE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM 25 TO THE EMPLOYEES' PENSION SYSTEM ON OR AFTER DECEMBER 1, 1997. 26 26-202. 27 Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, an individual described (a) 28 in § 26-201 of this subtitle is a member of the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension 29 System as a condition of employment. - 4 with disabilities to enhance the safety of people with disabilities in conformity with
- 5 the "Uniform System for Parking for Persons with Disabilities" (23 CFR Part 1235)
- 6 and the "Americans with Disabilities Act Accessibility Guidelines for Buildings and
