30 WHEREAS, The Maryland School for the Blind provides an essential service for 31 some blind children in the State; and

32 WHEREAS, A minimum level of funding is necessary to cover the costs of

33 inflation and enrollment growth and to ensure adequate maintenance of the School's34 existing programs; and

35 WHEREAS, Education programs and other services to the School's students 36 should not be reduced or disrupted during the school year as a result of mid-year

37 appropriation reductions; and

1 WHEREAS, There is a need to expand the educational options in Maryland for 2 students who have other severe disabilities; and

3 WHEREAS, The Maryland Department of Education has the responsibility to 4 monitor the programs provided by the School; now, therefore,
