1 AN ACT concerning

2 **School Construction - Apprenticeship Program**

3 FOR the purpose of requiring that each State-funded school construction project
4 shall require the contractor to have a certain apprenticeship program; requiring
5 that the contractor hire apprentices at a certain ratio to the number of
6 journeypersons; defining certain terms; and generally relating to school
7 construction contracts.

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 **Article - Education**

16 5-309.

17 (A) (1) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS
18 INDICATED.

19 (2) "APPROVED AND REGISTERED APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM" MEANS A
20 PROGRAM THAT IS:

21 (I) REGISTERED IN THIS STATE; AND

1 (II) APPROVED BY THE APPRENTICESHIP AND TRAINING COUNCIL
2 UNDER § 11-403 OF THE LABOR AND EMPLOYMENT ARTICLE.

3 (3) "CONSTRUCTION" MEANS:

4 (I) BUILDING;

5 (II) RECONSTRUCTING;

6 (III) IMPROVING;

7 (IV) ENLARGING;

8 (V) PAINTING OR DECORATING;

9 (VI) ALTERING;

10 (VII) MAINTAINING; OR

11 (VIII) REPAIRING.

12 (B) A CONTRACT FOR A SCHOOL CONSTRUCTION PROJECT THAT IS FUNDED IN
13 WHOLE OR IN ANY PART BY STATE FUNDS SHALL REQUIRE THE CONTRACTOR TO:

14 (1) HAVE IN PLACE AN APPROVED AND REGISTERED APPRENTICESHIP
15 PROGRAM; AND

16 (2) HIRE STATE-REGISTERED APPRENTICES AT A RATIO OF ONE
17 APPRENTICE FOR EVERY THREE JOURNEYPERSONS.

18 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
19 October 1, 1998.
