FOR the purpose of suspending the voluntary allowance uniformity provision for a eertain time until after a certain date, a requirement that a producer, refiner, or wholesaler of motor fuel extend voluntary allowances uniformly to all retail service station dealers supplied by the producer, refiner, or wholesaler; and generally relating to the sale of gasoline products.

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
15 Article - Business Regulation
16 10-312.
Each producer, refiner, or wholesaler of motor fuel who supplies motor fuel to retail service station dealers:
19 (1) <u>AFTER SEPTEMBER 30, 2000,</u> shall extend all voluntary allowances 20 uniformly to all retail service station dealers supplied;

- 1 shall apply all equipment rentals uniformly to all retail service (2) 2 station dealers supplied; and 3 (3) during periods of shortage: (i) shall apportion uniformly and equitably all gasoline and special 5 fuel to all retail service station dealers supplied; and may not discriminate among retail service station dealers (ii) 6 7 supplied in their allotments. THE PROVISIONS OF SUBSECTION (1) OF THIS SECTION DO NOT 8 (4) 9 APPLY DURING THE TIME PERIOD AFTER JULY 1, 1998 THROUGH TO OCTOBER 1, 2000.
- 10 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take 11 effect July 1, 1998.
