A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Breast Cancer Screening Program**

3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene to
4 establish a Breast Cancer Screening Program; specifying that the Program is to
5 be administered by the local health departments in a certain manner; specifying
6 eligibility for the Program; requiring the Department to fund the Program;
7 requiring the Department to adopt regulations; defining certain terms; and
8 generally relating to the Breast Cancer Screening Program.

14 Preamble

15 WHEREAS, Approximately 3,400 Maryland women are stricken with breast
16 cancer each year and approximately 800 of them die from the disease; and

17 WHEREAS, Early detection through mammography screening is by far the most
18 important tool medical science has in fighting breast cancer; and

19 WHEREAS, A mammography screening program conducted by the Health
20 Services Cost Review Commission for low-income, underinsured and low-income,
21 uninsured women age 40 years and over, which detected an estimated 500 cases of
22 breast cancer in nearly 4 years, expired on June 30, 1997 with no comprehensive
23 replacement program in place for thousands of women who need mammograms, but
24 cannot afford them; and

25 WHEREAS, There is a need to continue and expand on the existing federally
26 funded U.S. Centers for Disease Control Breast Cancer and Cervical Screening

1 Program in this State due to the expiration of the mammography screening program
2 conducted by HSCRC; and

3 WHEREAS, The State of Maryland has conducted, for several years, a vigorous
4 public campaign urging women to get their yearly mammograms; and

5 WHEREAS, The Maryland General Assembly believes women age 40 years and
6 over should not be denied the opportunity to get a mammogram because of their lack
7 of financial resources; now, therefore,

8 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
9 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

10 **Article - Health - General**

11 20-116.

12 (A) (1) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS
13 INDICATED.

14 (2) "CLINICAL BREAST EXAMINATION" MEANS A BREAST EXAMINATION
15 PERFORMED BY A HEALTH CARE PROFESSIONAL FOR THE PURPOSE OF DETECTING
16 BREAST CANCER.

17 (3) "ELIGIBLE INDIVIDUAL" MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO
18 RECEIVE BENEFITS UNDER THE PROGRAM IN ACCORDANCE WITH SUBSECTION (D)
19 OF THIS SECTION.

20 (4) "MAMMOGRAM" MEANS AN X-RAY EXAMINATION OF THE BREAST
21 USING DEDICATED EQUIPMENT, INCLUDING X-RAY TUBE, FILTER, COMPRESSION
22 DEVICE, SCREENS, FILMS, AND CASSETTES, SPECIFICALLY FOR MAMMOGRAPHY
23 THAT DELIVERS AN AVERAGE RADIATION EXPOSURE OF LESS THAN ONE RAD
24 MID-BREAST WITH TWO VIEWS FOR EACH BREAST.

25 (5) "PROGRAM" MEANS THE BREAST CANCER SCREENING PROGRAM.

26 (B) (1) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ESTABLISH A BREAST CANCER
27 SCREENING PROGRAM.

28 (2) THE PURPOSE OF THE PROGRAM IS TO PROVIDE AN ANNUAL
29 SCREENING MAMMOGRAM AND CLINICAL BREAST EXAMINATION TO LOW-INCOME,
30 UNDERINSURED AND LOW-INCOME, UNINSURED WOMEN AGED 40 YEARS AND OVER.

31 (C) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ADMINISTER THE PROGRAM THROUGH THE
32 LOCAL HEALTH DEPARTMENTS USING A GRANT PROGRAM UNDER WHICH A LOCAL
33 HEALTH DEPARTMENT MAKES ARRANGEMENTS WITH HEALTH CARE FACILITIES TO
34 PROVIDE ANNUAL SCREENING MAMMOGRAMS AND CLINICAL BREAST
35 EXAMINATIONS TO ELIGIBLE INDIVIDUALS.

36 (D) AN INDIVIDUAL IS ELIGIBLE FOR THE PROGRAM IF THE INDIVIDUAL:

1 (1) HAS A FAMILY INCOME AT OR BELOW 250% OF THE FEDERAL
2 POVERTY LEVEL; AND

3 (2) DOES NOT HAVE ACCESS TO HEALTH INSURANCE COVERAGE THAT
4 COVERS SCREENING MAMMOGRAMS AND CLINICAL BREAST EXAMINATIONS FOR
5 WOMEN AGED 40 YEARS AND OLDER.

6 (E) BEGINNING FISCAL YEAR 1999, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PROVIDE AT
7 LEAST \$4,200,000 EACH YEAR FROM ITS GENERAL FUND APPROPRIATION TO FUND
8 THE PROGRAM TO EXPAND UPON THE EXISTING FEDERALLY-FUNDED CENTERS FOR
9 DISEASE CONTROL BREAST AND CERVICAL CANCER SCREENING PROGRAM.

10 (F) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS NECESSARY TO
11 IMPLEMENT THE PROGRAM.

12 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
13 July 1, 1998.
