Procurement - Security for Construction Contracts

3 FOR the purpose of altering the threshold dollar amount in a requirement that

4 contractors provide payment security and performance security under certain

5 construction contracts awarded by certain public bodies; altering the threshold

6 dollar amount in a provision authorizing Baltimore City to adopt a program to

7 satisfy certain bonding requirements; *requiring that the program provide for a*

8 <u>certain minimum level of payment security;</u> and generally relating to required

9 security for construction contracts under the Procurement Law.

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SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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Article - State Finance and Procurement

4 17-102.

5 (a) This subtitle does not limit the authority of a public body to require 6 performance security in addition to, or in cases other than, those specified under §§ 7 17-103, 17-104, 17-106, and 17-107 of this subtitle.

8 (b) This subtitle applies only to security for a construction contract.

9 (c) (1) By ordinance, Baltimore City may provide for a program to satisfy 10 the bonding requirements under §§ 17-103, 17-104, 17-106, and 17-107 of this 11 subtitle with respect to any construction contract:

12 (1) (1) that does not exceed [\$100,000] \$200,000; and

13 (2) (II) for which State money is not used.

14(2)THE PROGRAM SHALL PROVIDE FOR PAYMENT SECURITY OF AT15LEAST 50% OF THE TOTAL AMOUNT PAYABLE UNDER THE CONTRACT.

17 (a) (1) Before a public body awards a construction contract exceeding 18 [\$50,000] \$100,000, the contractor shall provide payment security and performance 19 security that meet the requirements of § 17-104 of this subtitle.

20 (2) The security shall be:

21 (i) for performance security, in an amount that the public body 22 considers adequate for its protection; and

23 (ii) for payment security, at least 50% of the total amount payable24 under the contract.

25 (b) A public body, other than the State or a unit of the State government, may 26 require payment security or performance security for a construction contract if:

29 (2) the amount of the security does not exceed 50% of the contract30 amount.

31 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 32 October 1, 1998.

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
