1 AN ACT concerning

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Militia - Honor Guard at Burial Service of Veteran

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Adjutant General to organize an honor guard

4 from the National Guard or the organized militia to attend the burial services of

5 certain veterans under certain circumstances; authorizing the Adjutant General

6 to request an honor guard from a certain veterans' organization to attend the

7 burial service of a certain veteran under certain circumstances; providing for the

8 composition of the honor guard; requiring the Governor <u>Adjutant General</u> to

9 adopt regulations to implement this Act; providing the Adjutant General with

10 the funds to compensate the honor guards and a certain staff at a certain rate;

11 and generally relating to militia and an honor guard at the burial service of a

12 certain veteran.

1 Section 6 Annotated Code of Maryland 2 3 (1995 Replacement Volume and 1997 Supplement) 4 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 5 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article 65 - Militia 6 7 6. (A) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS 8 (1)9 INDICATED. 10 (2)"NATIONAL GUARD" MEANS THE ARMY NATIONAL GUARD, THE AIR 11 NATIONAL GUARD. OR THE MARYLAND DEFENSE FORCE. 12 (3)"VETERAN" MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL WHO: SERVED ON ACTIVE DUTY IN THE ARMED FORCES OF THE 13 (\mathbf{H}) 14 UNITED STATES DURING A TIME OF CONFLICT, AS DEFINED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF 15 DEFENSE: OR (II)SERVED AS A MEMBER OF THE NATIONAL GUARD AND DIED 16 17 WHILE A MEMBER OF THE NATIONAL GUARD. 18 THE ADJUTANT GENERAL MAY ORGANIZE A UNIFORMED (B) (A)(1)19 HONOR GUARD FROM THE NATIONAL GUARD OR THE ORGANIZED MILITIA TO 20 ATTEND THE BURIAL SERVICE OF A DECEASED VETERAN IF: 21 THE COMMANDER OF AN ACCREDITED VETERANS' (\mathbf{I}) 22 ORGANIZATION OR A FRIEND OR RELATIVE OF THE DECEASED VETERAN REQUESTS 23 AN HONOR GUARD TO ATTEND THE BURIAL SERVICE; A UNIFORMED HONOR GUARD FROM THE ACTIVE ARMED 24 (II) 25 FORCES OR VETERANS' ORGANIZATION IS NOT AVAILABLE; AND (III) THE ADJUTANT GENERAL DETERMINES THAT PROVISION OF 26 27 AN HONOR GUARD WILL NOT HAVE A DETRIMENTAL EFFECT ON THE READINESS OF 28 THE NATIONAL GUARD IN THE EVENT OF A STATE OR FEDERAL EMERGENCY OR THE 29 EMPLOYMENT OF A NATIONAL GUARD MEMBER. IF AN HONOR GUARD FROM THE ACTIVE ARMED FORCES IS NOT 30 (2)31 AVAILABLE. THE ADJUTANT GENERAL MAY REOUEST AN HONOR GUARD FROM A 32 VETERANS' ORGANIZATION TO ATTEND THE BURIAL SERVICE OF A DECEASED 33 VETERAN.

34 (C) THE HONOR GUARD SHALL PERFORM AS A MILITARY HONOR GUARD AND
35 A SQUAD TO FIRE VOLLEYS AT THE BURIAL SERVICE OF A DECEASED VETERAN.

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1 (D) THE HONOR GUARD SHALL CONSIST OF NOT MORE THAN FIVE RIFLE 2 BEARERS AND A BUGLER.

3(E)(B)REASONABLE COMPENSATION OF HONOR GUARD MEMBERS SHALL4BE SET BY THE ADJUTANT GENERAL, BUT NOT TO EXCEED 75% OF 1 DAY'S BASIC PAY,5PLUS OTHER EXPENSES INCURRED TO PARTICIPATE IN THE BURIAL SERVICE OF A6DECEASED VETERAN.

7 (<u>C)</u> THE ADJUTANT GENERAL SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO IMPLEMENT 8 THIS SECTION.

9 (F) (1) THE GOVERNOR SHALL PROVIDE, IN THE ANNUAL BUDGET, 10 SUFFICIENT FUNDS FOR THE COMPENSATION OF:

11 (I) THE HONOR GUARDS; AND

12 (II) THE NATIONAL GUARD PERSONNEL WHO COORDINATE HONOR 13 GUARD PARTICIPATION IN THE BURIAL SERVICES.

14 (2) COMPENSATION OF HONOR GUARD MEMBERS SHALL BE AT THE

15 RATE OF 75% OF 1 DAY'S BASIC PAY; HOWEVER, THE COMPENSATION MAY NOT BE

16 LESS THAN \$30 NOR MORE THAN \$60 PER DAY, PLUS OTHER EXPENSES INCURRED TO

17 PARTICIPATE IN THE BURIAL SERVICE OF A DECEASED VETERAN.

18 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect

19 October 1, 1998.
