1 AN ACT concerning						
2 Crimes and Punishments - Vehicle Laws - Fleeing or Eluding a Police 3 Officer - Penalties						
FOR the purpose of making it a felony for an individual to attempt to elude a police officer by certain means; imposing certain penalties; defining certain terms; altering certain provisions and penalties in the vehicle laws relating to fleeing and eluding a police officer; and generally relating to penalties for fleeing or eluding a police officer.

19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 20 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

AN INDIVIDUAL WHO VIOLATES THIS SECTION IS GUILTY OF A FELONY 18 19 AND ON CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO THE FOLLOWING PENALTIES: EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPHS (3) AND (4) OF THIS 20 21 SUBSECTION, FOR A FIRST OFFENSE, A FINE OF NOT MORE THAN \$1,000. 22 IMPRISONMENT NOT EXCEEDING 1 YEAR, OR BOTH; (2)EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPHS (3) AND (4) OF THIS 23 24 SUBSECTION, FOR A SECOND OR SUBSEQUENT OFFENSE, A FINE OF NOT MORE THAN 25 \$1,000, IMPRISONMENT NOT EXCEEDING 2 YEARS, OR BOTH; FOR AN OFFENSE RESULTING IN BODILY INJURY OR PROPERTY 26 27 DAMAGE CAUSED BY THE FLEEING INDIVIDUAL OR A PURSUING OFFICER, A FINE OF 28 NOT MORE THAN \$5,000, IMPRISONMENT NOT EXCEEDING 5 YEARS, OR BOTH; AND FOR AN OFFENSE RESULTING IN THE DEATH OF ANOTHER 30 INDIVIDUAL CAUSED BY THE FLEEING INDIVIDUAL OR THE PURSUING OFFICER. A 31 FINE OF NOT MORE THAN \$10,000, IMPRISONMENT NOT EXCEEDING 10 YEARS, OR 32 BOTH.
