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CHAPTER \_\_\_\_\_

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Creation of a State Debt - Federated Charities Corporation of Frederick**

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt not to exceed ~~\$500,000~~  
4 \$225,000, the proceeds to be used as a grant to the Board of Directors of the  
5 Federated Charities Corporation of Frederick for certain acquisition,  
6 development, or improvement purposes; providing for disbursement of the loan  
7 proceeds, subject to a requirement that the grantee provide and expend a  
8 matching fund; requiring the grantee to grant and convey to the Maryland  
9 Historical Trust a certain kind of easement; and providing generally for the  
10 issuance and sale of bonds evidencing the loan.

11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
12 MARYLAND, That:

13 (1) The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on  
14 behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the Federated  
15 Charities Corporation of Frederick Loan of 1998 in a total principal amount equal to  
16 the lesser of (i) ~~\$500,000~~ \$225,000 or (ii) the amount of the matching fund provided in  
17 accordance with Section 1(5) below. This loan shall be evidenced by the issuance, sale,  
18 and delivery of State general obligation bonds authorized by a resolution of the Board  
19 of Public Works and issued, sold, and delivered in accordance with §§ 8-117 through  
20 8-124 of the State Finance and Procurement Article and Article 31, § 22 of the Code.

21 (2) The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan may be sold as  
22 a single issue or may be consolidated and sold as part of a single issue of bonds under  
23 § 8-122 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.

1 (3) The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the Treasurer  
2 and first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling, and  
3 delivering the bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and then  
4 shall be credited on the books of the Comptroller and expended, on approval by the  
5 Board of Public Works, for the following public purposes, including any applicable  
6 architects' and engineers' fees: as a grant to the Board of Directors of the Federated  
7 Charities Corporation of Frederick (referred to hereafter in this Act as "the grantee")  
8 for the repair, renovation, reconstruction, construction, and capital equipping of a  
9 building in Frederick County, including renovations for compliance with the  
10 Americans with Disabilities Act, the building to be used as a human services center  
11 for community agencies in Frederick County, and for necessary demolition at the site.

12 (4) An annual State tax is imposed on all assessable property in the State in  
13 rate and amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds, as and  
14 when due and until paid in full. The principal shall be discharged within 15 years  
15 after the date of issuance of the bonds.

16 (5) Prior to the payment of any funds under the provisions of this Act for the  
17 purposes set forth in Section 1(3) above, the grantee shall provide and expend a  
18 matching fund. No part of the grantee's matching fund may be provided, either  
19 directly or indirectly, from funds of the State, whether appropriated or  
20 unappropriated. No part of the fund may consist of in kind contributions. The fund  
21 may consist of real property or funds expended prior to the effective date of this Act.  
22 In case of any dispute as to the amount of the matching fund or what money or assets  
23 may qualify as matching funds, the Board of Public Works shall determine the matter  
24 and the Board's decision is final. The grantee has until June 1, 2000, to present  
25 evidence satisfactory to the Board of Public Works that a matching fund will be  
26 provided. If satisfactory evidence is presented, the Board shall certify this fact and  
27 the amount of the matching fund to the State Treasurer, and the proceeds of the loan  
28 equal to the amount of the matching fund shall be expended for the purposes provided  
29 in this Act. Any amount of the loan in excess of the amount of the matching fund  
30 certified by the Board of Public Works shall be canceled and be of no further effect.

31 (6) (a) Prior to the issuance of the bonds, the grantee shall grant and convey  
32 to the Maryland Historical Trust a perpetual preservation easement to the extent of  
33 its interest:

34 (i) On the land or such portion of the land acceptable to the Trust;  
35 and

36 (ii) On the exterior and interior, where appropriate, of the historic  
37 structures.

38 (b) The easement must be in form and substance acceptable to the Trust  
39 and the extent of the interest to be encumbered must be acceptable to the Trust.

40 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
41 June 1, 1998.
