20 medical follow-up treatment if there is a significant risk of developing a

## **SENATE BILL 760**

- WHEREAS, The Radiation Experiment Assessment Project has concluded that
- 2 children treated with nasal radium irradiation are at a 10-fold higher mortality risk
- 3 for cancer than veterans who were treated similarly during the 1940's; and
- 4 WHEREAS, The United States government has failed to notify nasal radium
- 5 irradiation test subjects that they are at risk for various head and neck cancers and
- 6 hormonal and other problems, and various government agencies have engaged in
- 7 possible misrepresentation, fraud, and abuse in relating the facts regarding nasal
- 8 radium irradiation treatment; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Hospitals, public clinics, and private physicians have failed to
- 10 notify the surviving participants of nasal radium irradiation treatments of the
- 11 potential risks involved in the treatment; now, therefore,
- 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 14 Article 41 Governor Executive and Administrative Departments
- 15 18-316.
- 16 (A) THERE IS A TASK FORCE TO STUDY THE LONG-TERM HEALTH
- 17 CONSEQUENCES OF NASAL RADIUM IRRADIATION MEDICAL PROCEDURES ON
- 18 RECIPIENTS OF THOSE PROCEDURES.
- 19 (B) THE TASK FORCE CONSISTS OF NINE MEMBERS AS FOLLOWS:
- 20 (1) ONE MEMBER OF THE SENATE OF MARYLAND, APPOINTED BY THE
- 21 PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE;
- 22 (2) ONE MEMBER OF THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES OF MARYLAND,
- 23 APPOINTED BY THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE;
- 24 (3) TWO REPRESENTATIVES OF THE MEDICAL AND CHIRURGICAL
- 25 FACULTY OF MARYLAND, APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR;
- 26 (4) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE MARYLAND HOSPITAL ASSOCIATION,
- 27 APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR:
- 28 (5) THREE MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC, JOINTLY APPOINTED BY THE
- 29 GOVERNOR, THE PRESIDENT, AND THE SPEAKER; AND
- 30 (6) THE SECRETARY OF HEALTH AND MENTAL HYGIENE OR THE
- 31 SECRETARY'S DESIGNEE.
- 32 (C) THE SECRETARY OF HEALTH AND MENTAL HYGIENE OR THE SECRETARY'S
- 33 <u>DESIGNEE</u> SHALL SERVE AS CHAIRMAN OF THE TASK FORCE.
- 34 (D) A MEMBER OF THE TASK FORCE:

- 1 (1) MAY NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION FOR SERVING ON THE TASK 2 FORCE: BUT
- 3 (2) IS ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES UNDER THE 4 STANDARD STATE TRAVEL REGULATIONS, AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET.
- 5 (E) THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND MENTAL HYGIENE SHALL PROVIDE 6 STAFF FOR THE TASK FORCE.
- 7 (F) THE TASK FORCE SHALL:
- 8 (1) DETERMINE WHETHER SURVIVING RECIPIENTS OF NASAL RADIUM 9 IRRADIATION TREATMENTS HAVE CONTRACTED HEAD, NECK, OR OTHER CANCERS 10 OR HEALTH PROBLEMS THAT COULD BE ATTRIBUTED TO THOSE TREATMENTS;
- 11 (2) OTHERWISE DETERMINE THE CURRENT STATE OF HEALTH OF
- 12 SURVIVING RECIPIENTS OF NASAL RADIUM IRRADIATION TREATMENTS WHO
- 13 RECEIVED THOSE TREATMENTS AT ANY TIME FROM 1948 THROUGH 1960;
- 14 (3) MAKE OTHER APPROPRIATE FINDINGS IN RELATION TO NASAL
- 15 RADIUM IRRADIATION TREATMENT AND ITS EFFECT ON THE RECIPIENTS OF THAT
- 16 TREATMENT: AND
- 17 (4) DETERMINE HOW RECIPIENTS OF NASAL RADIUM IRRADIATION
- 18 TREATMENT SHOULD BE:
- 19 (I) NOTIFIED OF THE RISK OF CANCER AND OTHER DISEASES AND
- 20 DISORDERS; AND
- 21 (II) ADMINISTERED APPROPRIATE MEDICAL CARE AND
- 22 TREATMENT.
- 23 (G) NOT LATER THAN DECEMBER 31, 1999, THE TASK FORCE SHALL SUBMIT A
- 24 REPORT OF ITS FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE GOVERNOR AND,
- 25 SUBJECT TO § 2-1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, TO THE GENERAL
- 26 ASSEMBLY.
- 27 (H) THE TASK FORCE SHALL TERMINATE ON JANUARY 1, 2000.
- 28 (I) THIS SECTION MAY NOT BE CONSTRUED TO REQUIRE THE TASK FORCE TO
- 29 NOTIFY BY MAIL EVERY SURVIVING RECIPIENT OF NASAL RADIUM IRRADIATION
- 30 TREATMENTS OF THE RISK OF CANCER AND OTHER DISEASES OR DISORDERS.
- 31 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED. That this Act shall take effect
- 32 October 1, 1998.
