SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 (c) (1) Except on interstate highways, a vehicle carrying agricultural 16 products as defined under § 10-601 of the Agriculture Article or forest products that 17 have been loaded in fields or other off-highway locations is permitted an axle load 18 limit tolerance of 10 percent.

1 (2) Except on interstate highways, a single unit vehicle with 3 axles, or a 2 combination of vehicles with a trailer less than 32 feet long, either registered as a 3 farm vehicle or carrying agricultural products as defined under § 10-601 of the 4 Agriculture Article that were loaded in fields or other off-highway locations, is 5 permitted an axle load limit tolerance of 5 percent from § 24-109(b) and (c) of this subtitle, except during harvest time when a tolerance of 15 percent from § 24-109(b) 7 and (c) of this subtitle is permitted for a vehicle carrying the following agricultural 8 products:
