2 **Prince George's County - Alcoholic Beverages - Nudity and Sexual Displays**
3 **PG 322-98**

4 FOR the purpose of altering the penalty for a violation of certain provisions of law in
5 Prince George's County relating to nudity and certain public entertainment on
6 certain premises in which alcoholic beverages are consumed; clarifying that
7 those provisions of law in Prince George's County apply to premises that are not
8 licensed under the alcoholic beverages laws; and generally relating to alcoholic
9 beverages in Prince George's County.

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

17 **Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages**

18 11-304.

19 (r) (1) This subsection applies only in Prince George's County.

1 (2) (i) Alcoholic beverages may not be brought onto any UNLICENSED
2 premises and consumed or transferred if the UNLICENSED premises constitute a place
3 of public entertainment and the entertainment is of the type listed under § 10-405(c)
4 through (f) of this article.

5 (ii) Any person who operates a place of public entertainment who
6 knowingly permits any violation of this subsection on the UNLICENSED premises is
7 guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction may be fined up to \$5,000 for each
8 violation OR IMPRISONED UP TO 1 YEAR, OR BOTH.

9 (iii) Each day of operation in violation of this subsection is a
10 separate violation.

11 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
12 October 1, 1998.
