## SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION

1 A Senate Joint Resolution concerning

2 Crown Central Petroleum Lockout

- 3 FOR the purpose of urging Crown Central Petroleum to end its lockout and reach a
- 4 fair and equitable labor agreement with the Oil, Chemical and Atomic Workers
- 5 Union, AFL-CIO.
- 6 WHEREAS, Crown Central Petroleum locked out 250 members of the Oil,
- 7 Chemical and Atomic Workers Union, AFL-CIO, at its Pasadena, Texas refinery on
- 8 February 5, 1996; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Efforts to settle the dispute have not progressed, prompting the
- 10 national, State, and local AFL-CIO to place Crown gasoline on the official "Do Not
- 11 Buy" list; and
- 12 WHEREAS, An economic boycott against Crown, a Fortune 500 company located
- 13 in Baltimore, Maryland could have detrimental effects on the company, its employees,
- 14 and subcontractors; and
- WHEREAS, It is the policy of the State of Maryland to both promote business
- 16 and work with organized labor; and
- WHEREAS, Eight African American and female employees have filed a class
- 18 action suit alleging discrimination in promotions, and the creation of a hostile
- 19 working environment by Baltimore-based Crown; and
- 20 WHEREAS, Environmentalists and citizens have filed lawsuits alleging
- 21 numerous violations of the Clean Air Act by Crown; and
- 22 WHEREAS, The City Council of Baltimore, the National Black Caucus of State
- 23 Legislators, and the Maryland Council of the AFL-CIO have resolved that Crown
- 24 Central Petroleum end the lockout and reach a fair and equitable agreement with the
- 25 Oil, Chemical and Atomic Workers Union, AFL-CIO; now, therefore, be it
- 26 RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the
- 27 General Assembly calls upon Crown to end the lockout and reach a fair and equitable
- 28 agreement with the Oil, Chemical and Atomic Workers Union, AFL-CIO; and be it
- 29 further

- 1 RESOLVED, That the General Assembly calls upon Crown to meet and resolve
- 2 the disputes involving discrimination and environmental claims against the company;
- 3 and be it further
- 4 RESOLVED, That a copy of this Resolution be forwarded by the Department of
- 5 Legislative Services to the Honorable Parris N. Glendening, Governor of Maryland;
- 6 the Honorable Thomas V. Mike Miller, Jr., President of the Senate of Maryland; the
- 7 Honorable Casper R. Taylor, Jr., Speaker of the House of Delegates; and to Crown
- 8 Central Petroleum and to the Oil, Chemical and Atomic Workers Union, AFL-CIO.
