## **Occupational Safety and Health - Citations**

This bill alters the time period within which the Division of Labor and Industry is required to issue citations for violations of the Maryland Occupational Safety and Health Act (MOSHA).

Under current law, the division is required to issue a citation based on an inspection "with reasonable promptness". The bill requires the division to issue a citation based on an inspection with reasonable promptness, not to exceed the earlier of: (1) 90 days from the date of the closing conference on the inspection or investigation; or (2) 6 months from the occurrence of the violation. If the incident investigated by the division involves a fatality or serious physical harm, the division is required to issue a citation with reasonable promptness not to exceed 6 months from the date that the violation occurred.

## **Fiscal Summary**

**State Effect:** None. MOSH should be able to meet the bill's requirements with existing resources and without falling outside of federal OSHA requirements. The bill would not affect the workload of the Office of Administrative Hearings.
