#### **Circuit Court Clerks - Salary**

This bill increases the annual salary limit for the clerks of the circuit courts from \$64,000 to \$75,000, beginning with the next term of office.

## **Fiscal Summary**

**State Effect:** General fund expenditures could increase by approximately \$180,200 in FY 1999, which reflects a December 1, 1998 effective date for salary increases implemented pursuant to the bill. Out-year expenditures reflect annualization. Revenues would not be affected.

# **Fiscal Analysis**

**State Expenditures:** The salaries of the 24 clerks of the circuit courts are paid by the State. Salary increases for these employees are proposed by the Judiciary and must be approved by the Board of Public Works (BPW).

Currently, each clerk receives a salary of between \$59,000 and \$64,000. Because the relevant

statute provides that each clerk's salary is to be set based upon the relative volume of business and receipts in the clerk's office, it is apparent that all clerks cannot receive the maximum salary amount. Therefore, for purposes of this analysis, it is assumed that the Judiciary will propose an immediate salary increase of \$11,000 for each clerk (although actual proposed increases could vary). It is further assumed that the BPW would approve the increases proposed by the Judiciary, and that such increases would be effective December 1, 1998, the beginning of the next term of office.

Under this scenario, general fund expenditures would increase by an estimated \$180,180 in fiscal 1999. This estimate reflects an annual salary increase of \$11,000 for each of the 24 clerks for the last seven months of fiscal 1999, and \$26,180 in fringe benefits.

Total FY 1999 Expenditure Increase \$180,180

Future year expenditure increases of \$308,880 reflect full year salaries and fringe benefits. These employees do not receive cost-of-living adjustments.
