Senate Bill 331 (Senator Boozer. *et al.*)

Judicial Proceedings

State Prosecutor - Immunity and Subpoena Power

This bill authorizes the State Prosecutor to request that a court order an individual to testify if the prosecutor determines that the testimony may be necessary to the public interest and the individual has refused or is likely to refuse to testify. This testimony cannot be used against the witness, except in prosecution for perjury, obstruction of justice, or otherwise failing to comply with the order. Further, the bill gives the State Prosecutor the power to subpoena an individual to produce telephone, business, governmental, or corporate records or documents.
