Task Force to Study School Construction Work-Based Learning and Apprenticeship Programs

This bill establishes a 14-member task force to study existing school construction work-based learning and apprenticeship programs in the State. The task force must submit a final report containing its findings and recommendations on how to expand and improve work-based learning and apprenticeship programs involved with public school construction programs statewide to the Governor and General Assembly by December 15, 1999. The Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation and the Maryland State Department of Education are required to provide staff support.

This bill takes effect June 1, 1998.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: Any expense reimbursements for task force members and staffing costs for the Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation and the Maryland State Department of Education are assumed to be minimal and absorbable within existing resources.
