House Bill 352 (Delegate Getty, et al.)

Highways - Placement of Farm-Related Directional Signs

This bill provides that a permit is not required from the State Highway Administration (SHA) for an outdoor sign that directs motorists to a farm or other location where farmers offer their products for sale. However, these signs must comply with existing safety requirements, local restrictions, and zoning requirements.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: Minimal. It is estimated that SHA could experience an annual revenue decrease of less than \$5,000 as farmers will not need to apply for a permit to display certain signs. The fee for a permit to display outdoor signs that are placed outside the limits of a municipal corporation and within 500 feet of a State highway is between \$10 and \$35 annually depending upon the size of the sign.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: Minimal. Farmers may experience a small decrease in costs as they will not have to pay the annual \$10 to \$35 fee for a permit to display signs along State highways.
