Environmental Matters

Lead Paint - Restoration of Property - Exterior Surfaces

This bill provides that, in order to be exempted from lead risk reduction standards, exterior paint surfaces of an affected property with chipping, peeling, or flaking be restored with nonlead-based paint. Current law requires these surfaces to be lead-free.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None. The requirements of the bill would not materially affect State operations or finances.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: Potential meaningful.

Fiscal Analysis

Small Business Effect: Small business landlords who own affected property could be positively impacted by the bill to the extent that it would be less expensive to paint exterior surfaces with nonlead-based paint than to perform a lead-free restoration.
