State Anatomy Board - Unclaimed Bodies

This bill increases the time period, from 48 hours to 72 hours after death, in which an unclaimed body must be refrigerated by either the State Anatomy Board or a person who notifies the board of a death. It also alters the time period, from 48 hours to 72 hours after death, after which an unclaimed dead body is under the exclusive control of the board.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None. The Anatomy Board holds bodies for 14 days.

Small Business Effect: Potential minimal.
