Alcoholic Beverages - Drive-Through Facilities - Prohibition

This bill imposes a statewide prohibition against an alcoholic beverages licensee selling alcoholic beverages through a drive-through window. This provision does not apply to existing licensees that have drive-through facilities prior to February 1, 1998, or the transfer of an existing license that has a drive-through facility. Current law prohibits drive-through alcoholic beverage sales only in Carroll County.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None. Alcoholic beverage licenses are issued and monitored by local licensing authorities.

Local Effect: None. Boards of license commissioners could monitor alcoholic beverages licensees with existing resources. Because license fees for establishments with drive-through or walk-up windows are the same as for establishments without these facilities, license fee revenues would not be affected.

Small Business Effect: Minimal impact on small businesses.
