(Task Force to Examine Maryland's Crime Victims' Rights Laws)

Judicial Proceedings

Victims' Rights - Presence of Victims

This bill authorizes a victim's representative to be present at trial, or any other court proceeding, by expanding the meaning of "victim", "defendant", "representative", and "trial". The bill expands the number of crimes that are covered under these provisions by including juvenile acts and eliminating the need for the crime to have been a crime of violence.

The bill also narrows the circumstances in which a judge may order a victim to be sequestered by changing the grounds for sequestration from "good cause" to "materially affect the defendant's right to a fair trial". These provisions may not be construed to limit a victim's or representative's right to attend a trial or juvenile delinquency adjudicatory hearing as otherwise provided by statute.
