House Joint Resolution 4 (Delegate Tavior)

Commerce and Government Matters

Special Study Commission on the Maryland Public Ethics Law

This joint resolution establishes a 15-member Special Study Commission on the Maryland Public Ethics Law. Members will be the majority and minority leaders of the Senate and the House of Delegates, the co-chairmen of the Joint Committee on Legislative Ethics, and nine members of the general public. The commission will study matters related to legislative ethics including: (1) the relationship of members of the General Assembly to outside entities; (2) the use of offices, staff, equipment, and resources provided to Senators and Delegates by the State; (3) conflicts of interest and the disclosure of interests; and (4) the authority and powers of the Joint Committee on Legislative Ethics.

The commission must issue a report of its findings and any recommendations for legislation to the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House by February 1, 1999.
