## **Crimes - Adultery - Defined**

This bill codifies the definition of adultery for purposes of the divorce laws and the statute criminalizing adultery. The bill specifies that a married person who voluntarily has sexual intercourse or commits a sexual act with a person who is not the married person's spouse is guilty of adultery, and that a person who voluntarily has sexual intercourse or commits a sexual act with a married person who is not the person's spouse is guilty of adultery.

Because the statute defining "sexual act" is gender-neutral, the bill contemplates that homosexual acts can qualify as adultery.
