Judicial Proceedings

Restitution - Juvenile Delinquents

This bill prohibits a court from considering the age and circumstances of the child or the child's present or future ability to pay when determining whether to issue a judgment of restitution against a child.

Fiscal Analysis

However, restitution is infrequently ordered to be paid to government entities.
