### **Extrajurisdictional Authority for Police Officers - Joint Operation**

This bill authorizes a police officer to arrest a person throughout the State without jurisdictional limitations if participating in a joint police operation whereby: (1) a warrant has been issued against the person; (2) the officer is participating in an operation created by agreement between the "primary law enforcement officers"; (3) the arrest occurs or is initiated within one of the participating jurisdictions; and (4) the officer is acting in accordance with regulations adopted by the officer's agency to implement these provisions.

### **Fiscal Summary**

**State Effect:** None. While this bill could lead to better communications between and among State and local law enforcement agencies as well as some additional arrest efficiencies, there would be no effect on the overall operating costs of those agencies.
