#### **Public Service Commission - General Counsel - Oath**

This departmental bill repeals the requirement that the General Counsel of the Public Service Commission (PSC) must take the Maryland constitutional oath of office.

### **Fiscal Summary**

**State Effect:** None. Removing the oath requirement for the General Counsel of the PSC would not affect the salary of the position.

Local Effect: None.
