### Parent - Child Immunity - Motor Vehicle Cases - Abrogation

This bill abrogates the common law doctrine of parent-child immunity as it applies to actions for wrongful death, personal injury, or property damage arising from the operation of a motor vehicle. Under current law, lawsuits between parents and their minor children for personal torts are generally prohibited.

### **Fiscal Summary**

**Small Business Effect:** As a result of the bill, small insurance businesses could be required to make payment in connection with claims between minor children and their parents arising out of automobile accidents.
