### Public Libraries - Minimum Library Program - Maintenance of Effort

This bill prohibits a county from using State aid intended for the minimum library program to meet any other obligation for the maintenance of local funding for libraries.

### **Fiscal Summary**

**State Effect:** None. The State share of the minimum library program would remain the same.

**Local Effect:** None. Local appropriations to public libraries already exceed the minimum State requirement.

Small Business Effect: None.

# **Fiscal Analysis**

**Background:** The State minimum library program was established in 1962 to provide financial assistance to county public library systems. The State provides about 40% of the total cost of the minimum program and the counties provide 60%. The State share of the total is divided among the counties according to their relative wealth, with no county receiving less than 20% of its minimum program. Three counties (Montgomery, Talbot, and Worcester) receive the minimum State share. The minimum library program in fiscal 1999 totals \$47.3 million (\$9.25 per resident), with the State contribution totaling \$19.75 million. State aid under this program can only be used for library purposes.

**Local Effect:** County public library systems receive on average around 74% of their revenue from local governments and 19% from the State. As shown in **Exhibit 1**, local governments provided three times more funding to public libraries in fiscal 1997 than the State. As a condition to receive State library aid under the minimum library program, local governments must provide a minimum level of local funding to the county public library system. In fiscal 1999, the required minimum local appropriation will total \$28.4 million. Currently, all local governments fulfill this minimum funding requirement. Since local appropriations to public libraries already exceed the minimum State requirement by over \$69.2 million and since local governments are already prohibited from using State library aid to satisfy the required minimum local appropriation, this bill should not affect local finances in fiscal 1999.
