Economic Matters

Home Improvement Contracts

This bill provides that: (1) a home improvement contract that fails to satisfy the requirements of §8-501(b) of the Business Regulation Article may not be enforced by a contractor who directly or indirectly provides home improvement services under the contract; and (2) the contractor who fails to comply with §8-501(b) may not recover damages arising from a breach of the contract.

§8-501(b) provides that each home improvement contract must: (1) be in writing and legible; (2) describe clearly each document that it incorporates; and (3) be signed by each party to the home improvement contract.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None. This bill would not directly affect State operations or finances.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: Potential minimal effect. Small businesses which fail to comply with the requirements of §8-501 (b) could not enforce a home improvement contract or recover damages arising out of a breach of contract.
