#### **Commission on Computer Repair Technicians**

This bill establishes a nine-member Commission on Computer Repair Technicians to study issues relating to the licensure or certification of computer repair technicians in the State. The commission must submit a report with its recommendations to the Governor and the General Assembly by December 1, 1999. The Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation (DLLR) will provide staff support for the commission.

The bill sunsets when the report is submitted.

### **Fiscal Summary**

**State Effect:** None. The bill's requirements could be handled with existing resources.

Local Effect: None.

**Small Business Effect:** None.

## **Fiscal Analysis**

**State Effect:** The bill requires DLLR to provide staff support for the Commission on Computer Repair Technicians. The Department of Legislative Services advises that any additional workload to DLLR as a result of this bill could be handled with existing budgeted resources. However, DLLR advises that it would need to hire one contractual secretary for one year to handle calls, prepare the agenda, type minutes, and type reports. A contractual office secretary would cost \$19,920. DLLR advises that other staff support for the commission could be handled with existing resources.

The commission members would not be compensated. Any increase in expense reimbursements and postage costs associated with this bill could be handled with existing
