EACH HOSPICE FACILITY SHALL BE OPEN TO INSPECTIONS BY THE 10 (2)11 DEPARTMENT TO INVESTIGATE AND RESOLVE ANY COMPLAINT CONCERNING 12 PATIENT CARE OR CONFORMANCE TO THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SUBTITLE AND 13 THE REGULATIONS ADOPTED UNDER THIS SUBTITLE.

14 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 15 October 1, 1999.

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
