2 Crimes - Fraud - Personal Identity Theft

3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting an individual from assuming a person's identity for

- 4 certain purposes and with a certain intent; establishing certain penalties for a
- 5 violation of this Act; and generally relating to personal identification theft.
- 6 BY adding to

1 AN ACT concerning

- 7 Article 27 Crimes and Punishments
- 8 Section 231 to be under the new subheading "Fraud Personal Identity Theft"
- 9 Annotated Code of Maryland
- 10 (1996 Replacement Volume and 1998 Supplement)
- 11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 12 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 13 Article 27 Crimes and Punishments
- 14 FRAUD PERSONAL IDENTITY THEFT
- 15 231.
- 16 (A) A PERSON MAY NOT ASSUME THE IDENTITY OF ANOTHER PERSON WITH 17 THE INTENT TO:
- 18 (1) FRAUDULENTLY OBTAIN CREDIT, MONEY, GOODS, OR SERVICES;
- 19 (2) FRAUDULENTLY AVOID THE PAYMENT OF DEBT OR OTHER LEGAL 20 OBLIGATION; OR
- 21 (3) AVOID PROSECUTION FOR A CRIME.
- 22 (B) A PERSON WHO VIOLATES THIS SECTION IS GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR
- 23 AND ON CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO A FINE OF NOT MORE THAN \$10,000 OR
- 24 IMPRISONMENT FOR NOT MORE THAN 1 YEAR OR BOTH.

- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 2 October 1, 1999.
