 provisions of these appropriations the Secretary of Budget and Management is 35 authorized:

36 (a) To allot all or any portion of the funds herein appropriated to the various

11 (c) To fix the number and classes of positions, including temporary and 12 permanent positions, or person years of authorized employment for each agency, unit, 13 or program thereof, not inconsistent with the Public General Laws in regard to 14 classification of positions. The Secretary shall make such determinations before the 15 beginning of the fiscal year and shall base them on the positions or person years of 16 employment authorized in the budget as amended by approved budgetary position 17 actions. No payment for salaries or wages nor any request for or certification of 18 personnel shall be made except in accordance with the Secretary's determinations. At 19 any time during the fiscal year the Secretary may amend the number and classes of 20 positions or person years of employment previously fixed by the Secretary; the 21 Secretary may delegate all or part of this authority. The governing boards of public 22 institutions of higher education shall have the authority to transfer positions between 23 programs and campuses under each institutional board's jurisdiction without the 24 approval of the Secretary, as provided in Section 15-105 of the Education Article.

26 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That in accordance with 27 Section 7-109 of the State Finance and Procurement Article of the Annotated Code of 28 Maryland, it is the intention of the General Assembly to include herein a listing of 29 nonclassified flat rate or per diem positions by unit of State government, job 30 classification, the number in each job classification and the amount proposed for each classification. The President and the Speaker may make adjustments to positions 31 32 contained in the legislative portion of this section that are impacted by changes in 33 salary plans or by salary actions in the executive agencies. The Chief Judge of the 34 Court of Appeals may make adjustments to positions contained in the Judicial portion 35 of this section (other than judges) that are impacted by changes in salary plans or by 36 salary actions in the executive agencies. The salaries of the constitutional officers 37 listed in this section are the annual salaries for the next term in office. The salaries 38 below include the fiscal year 2000 adjustment for those positions eligible for the cost 39 of living allowance (COLA). For presentation purposes only, the salaries are the 40 annual salary amounts which will be effective on January 1, 2000. Eligible positions 41 in this section will receive the COLA according to the same schedule as positions in 42 the Standard Pay Plan.

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That if any person holding 4 an office of profit within the meaning of Article 35 of the Declaration of Rights, 5 Constitution of Maryland, is appointed to or otherwise becomes the holder of a second 6 office within the meaning of Article 35 of the Declaration of Rights, Constitution of 7 Maryland, then no compensation or other emolument, except expenses incurred in 8 connection with attendance at hearings, meetings, field trips, and working sessions, 9 shall be paid from any funds appropriated by this bill to that person for any services 10 in connection with the second office.

SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That amounts received
 pursuant to Sections 2-201 and 7-217 of the State Finance and Procurement Article
 may be expended by approved budget amendment.

SECTION 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That funds appropriated by
this bill may be transferred among programs in accordance with the procedure
provided in Sections 7-205 through 7-212, inclusive, of the State Finance and
Procurement Article.

18 SECTION 7. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, except as otherwise 19 provided, amounts received from sources estimated or calculated upon in the budget 20 in excess of the estimates for any special or federal fund appropriations listed in this 21 bill may be made available by approved budget amendment.

SECTION 8. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That authorization is hereby granted to transfer by budget amendment General Fund amounts for the operations of State office buildings and facilities to the budgets of the various agencies and departments occupying the buildings.

SECTION 9. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That \$7,100,000 is appropriated in the various agency budgets for tort claims (including motor vehicles) under the provisions of State Government Article, Title 12, Subtitle 1, the Maryland Tort Claims Act (MTCA). These funds are to be transferred to the State Insurance Trust Fund; these funds, together with funds appropriated in prior budgets for tort claims but unexpended, are the only funds available to make payments under the provisions of the MTCA. Tort claims are limited as follows:

33 (A) Tort claims for incidents or occurrences occurring after July 1, 1996, paid from

34 the State Insurance Trust Fund, are limited hereby and by State Treasurer's

35 regulations to payments of no more than \$100,000 to a single claimant for

36 injuries arising from a single incident or occurrence.

37 (B) Tort claims for incidents or occurrences resulting in death on or after July 1,

38 1994, and before July 1, 1996, paid from the State Insurance Trust Fund, are

39 limited hereby and by State Treasurer's regulations to payments of no more than

40 \$75,000 to a single claimant. All other tort claims occurring on or after July 1, 41 1994, and before July 1, 1996, paid from the State Insurance Trust Fund, are

42 limited hereby and by State Treasurer's regulations to payments of no more than

1 \$50,000 to a single claimant for injuries arising from a single incident or

2 occurrence.

3 (C) Tort claims for incidents or occurrences occurring prior to July 1, 1994, paid from

4 the State Insurance Trust Fund, are limited hereby and by State Treasurer's

5 regulations to payments of no more than \$50,000 to a single claimant for injuries

6 arising from a single incident or occurrence.

7 SECTION 10. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That authorization is 8 hereby granted to transfer by budget amendment General Fund amounts, budgeted to 9 the various State agency programs and subprograms which comprise the indirect cost 10 pools under the Statewide Indirect Cost Plan, from the State agencies providing such 11 services to the State agencies receiving the services. It is further authorized that 12 receipts by the State agencies providing such services from charges for the indirect 13 services may be used as special funds for operating expense of the indirect cost pools.

14 SECTION 11. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That certain funds 15 appropriated to the various State agency programs and subprograms in Comptroller 16 object 0882 (In-State Services-Computer Usage - ADC Only) shall be utilized to pay for services provided by the Comptroller of the Treasury, Data Processing Division, 17 18 Computer Center Operations (EA10.01) consistent with the reimbursement schedule provided for in the supporting budget documents. The expenditure or transfer of these 19 20 funds for other purposes requires the prior approval of the Secretary of Budget and Management. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Secretary of Budget 21 and Management may transfer amounts appropriated in Comptroller object 0882 22 23 between State departments and agencies by approved budget amendment in fiscal 24 year 2000.

25 SECTION 12. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, pursuant to Section 26 8-102 of the State Personnel and Pensions Article, the salary schedule for the 27 executive pay plan during fiscal year 2000 shall be as set forth below. Adjustments to 28 the salary schedule may be made during the fiscal year in accordance with the provisions of Sections 8-108 and 8-109 of the State Personnel and Pensions Article. 29 30 Notwithstanding the inclusion of salaries for positions which are determined by agencies with independent salary setting authority in the salary schedule set forth 31 below, such salaries may be adjusted during the fiscal year in accordance with such 32 33 salary setting authority. The salaries below include the fiscal year 2000 adjustment 34 for the cost of living allowance (COLA). For presentation purposes only, the salaries 35 are the annual salary amounts which will be effective on January 1, 2000. Positions in 36 this section will receive the COLA according to the same schedule as positions in the 37 Standard Pay Plan. Individuals recruited or promoted into the executive pay plan, 38 whether from within or outside the State government, or individuals promoted within 39 the executive pay plan shall receive a salary increase of not more than 6% unless the 40 Board of Public Works finds there are unusual circumstances that justify a larger

41 salary increase.

 SECTION 20. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That whenever the Joint Audit Committee, through its review and evaluation process of audit reports issued by the Legislative Auditor, and after consultation with the Legislative Auditor, determines, based upon exceptions contained in the audit reports, that a particular agency (to include department, administration, division, bureau, board, or commission) does not adequately comply with State laws, rules and regulations regarding the agency's fiscal and accounting record and procedures and/or fiscal administration activities, that the committee may recommend to the Governor that the Comptroller withhold up to 25% of the salary of the secretary of the department and/or of the State official deemed responsible. The amount to be withheld, the duration of such withholding, and the date of release of any amount withheld shall be 			

1 recommended by the committee after consultation with the Legislative Auditor,

- 2 including any recommendations that the Legislative Auditor deems appropriate. The
- 3 Governor shall advise the committee as to the decision regarding the committee's
- 4 recommendations. If the Governor directs that the salary of the head of the agency
- 5 and/or salary of the secretary of the department and/or salary of the State official
- 6 deemed responsible be withheld, the Governor may recommend the date on which the
- 7 salary shall be restored to the full amount as provided in the budget and the amount
- 8 to be withheld to be paid. The committee shall consider the recommendations of the
- 9 Governor and advise the Governor as to its decision whether or not to allow the salary
- 10 to be restored to the full amount as provided in the budget and the amount withheld
