8 FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt in the amount of ~~Four~~  
9 ~~Hundred Twenty Six Million, Two Hundred Ninety One Thousand Four~~  
10 ~~Hundred Nineteen Million, Five Hundred Nine Thousand~~ *Four Hundred*  
11 *Nineteen Million, Eight Hundred Fifty Nine Thousand* Dollars ~~(\$426,291,000)~~  
12 ~~(\$419,509,000) (\$419,859,000)~~, the proceeds to be used for certain necessary  
13 building, construction, demolition, planning, renovation, conversion,  
14 replacement, and capital equipment purchases of this State, and for acquiring  
15 certain real estate in connection therewith, and for grants to certain  
16 subdivisions and other organizations for certain purposes, subject to the  
17 requirement that certain grantees provide certain matching funds of a certain

1 type by a certain date; providing generally for the issuance and sale of bonds  
2 evidencing the loan; providing for certain unexpended appropriations in prior  
3 Capital Budgets and Bond Acts to be expended for other public projects; altering  
4 certain requirements for certain programs in prior Capital Budgets; providing  
5 that the authorizations of State Debt in certain prior Capital Budgets and Bond

29 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
 30 MARYLAND, That:

31 (1) The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on  
 32 behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the Maryland  
 33 Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 1999 in the total principal amount of ~~\$426,291,000~~  
 34 ~~\$419,509,000~~ \$419,859,000. This loan shall be evidenced by the issuance, sale, and  
 35 delivery of State general obligation bonds authorized by a resolution of the Board of  
 36 Public Works and issued, sold, and delivered in accordance with Sections 8-117

1 through 8-124 of the State Finance and Procurement Article and Article 31, Section  
2 22 of the Code.

3 (2) The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan may be sold as  
4 a single issue of bonds under Section 8-122 of the State Finance and Procurement  
5 Article.

6 (3) The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the Treasurer  
7 and first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling, and  
8 delivering the bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and then  
9 shall be credited on the books of the Comptroller and expended, on approval by the  
10 Board of Public Works, for the following public purposes, including any applicable
