2 **Creation of a State Debt - Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of**  
3 **1999, Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loans of 1991, 1992, 1994, 1995,**  
4 **1996, 1997, and 1998, the General Construction Loan of 1989, the Avalon**  
5 **Theatre Loan of 1990, the Frederick County - Lamar Sanitarium - Historic**  
6 **Museum Loan of 1996, and the Baltimore County and Allegany County**  
7 **Detention Centers Loan of 1991**

8 FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt in the amount of ~~Four~~  
9 ~~Hundred Twenty-Six Million, Two Hundred Ninety-One Thousand Four~~  
10 ~~Hundred Nineteen Million, Five Hundred Nine Thousand~~ Dollars  
11 ~~(\$426,291,000) (\$419,509,000),~~ the proceeds to be used for certain necessary  
12 building, construction, demolition, planning, renovation, conversion,  
13 replacement, and capital equipment purchases of this State, and for acquiring  
14 certain real estate in connection therewith, and for grants to certain  
15 subdivisions and other organizations for certain purposes, subject to the  
16 requirement that certain grantees provide certain matching funds of a certain  
17 type by a certain date; providing generally for the issuance and sale of bonds  
18 evidencing the loan; providing for certain unexpended appropriations in prior  
19 Capital Budgets and Bond Acts to be expended for other public projects; altering  
20 certain requirements for certain programs in prior Capital Budgets; providing  
21 that the authorizations of State Debt in certain prior Capital Budgets and Bond  
22 Acts be reduced by certain amounts; and generally relating to the financing of  
23 certain capital projects.

18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
19 MARYLAND, That:

20 (1) The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on  
21 behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the Maryland  
22 Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 1999 in the total principal amount of ~~\$426,291,000~~  
23 \$419,509,000. This loan shall be evidenced by the issuance, sale, and delivery of State  
24 general obligation bonds authorized by a resolution of the Board of Public Works and  
25 issued, sold, and delivered in accordance with Sections 8-117 through 8-124 of the  
26 State Finance and Procurement Article and Article 31, Section 22 of the Code.

27 (2) The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan may be sold as  
28 a single issue of bonds under Section 8-122 of the State Finance and Procurement  
29 Article.

30 (3) The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the Treasurer  
31 and first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling, and  
32 delivering the bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and then  
33 shall be credited on the books of the Comptroller and expended, on approval by the  
34 Board of Public Works, for the following public purposes, including any applicable  
35 architects' and engineers' fees:

5 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the General Assembly  
 6 declares that it is the public policy of this State to manage State general obligation  
 7 bond debt in a manner that will maintain Maryland's AAA bond rating. The General  
 8 Assembly further declares that legislative oversight, control, and review of all forms  
 9 of State obligations is essential to maintenance of the State's existing bond rating and  
 10 protection of the fiscal integrity of the State.

11 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, before work may  
 12 commence pursuant to any supplement to any appropriation contained herein,  
 13 satisfactory assurance must be given to the Board of Public Works that the project can  
 14 be completed with the aggregate of the funds herein and heretofore appropriated for  
 15 the stated purpose.

16 SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, with the approval of  
 17 the Department of Budget and Management, any appropriation for construction  
 18 provided in this Act may be used to purchase capital equipment if the amount of the  
 19 appropriation exceeds the amount required for construction expenses, including  
 20 allowances for contingencies.

21 SECTION 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, except as otherwise  
 22 provided in this Act, before a State agency or institution named in this Act as  
 23 responsible for an individual item may begin work with funds appropriated by this  
 24 Act, the agency or institution shall provide satisfactory evidence to the Board of  
 25 Public Works that the work described in the individual item can be completed with  
 26 the funds specified for that item.

27 SECTION 7. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, with the approval of  
 28 the Department of Budget and Management, any appropriation under the provisions  
 29 of this Act that is in excess of the amount needed for a project may be credited to the  
 30 Construction Contingency Fund under Section 3-609 of the State Finance and  
 31 Procurement Article.

32 SECTION 8. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, if federal funds are  
 33 available to help accomplish any project identified in this Act, the State agency or  
 34 institution responsible for the project shall make efforts through proper  
 35 administrative procedures to obtain these federal funds. Before spending any funds  
 36 appropriated by this Act, the agency or institution shall certify its efforts to the Board  
 37 of Public Works and state the reason for any failure to obtain federal funds. If federal  
 38 funds are obtained, they shall be used to defray the costs of the project described in  
 39 this Act, and not to expand its scope.

40 SECTION 9. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, for any appropriation  
 41 for planning of a State-owned project provided in this Act, if a program required by  
 42 Section 3-602(d) of the State Finance and Procurement Article has not been



1 submitted, then the State agency or institution responsible for the project shall  
 2 submit a program to the Department of Budget and Management for approval before  
 3 funds may be expended from the appropriation. For any appropriation for  
 4 construction of a State-owned project provided in this Act, if preliminary plans and  
 5 outline specifications required by Section 3-602(f)(2)(i) of the State Finance and  
 6 Procurement Article have not been prepared, then the State agency or institution  
 7 responsible for the project shall submit preliminary plans and outline specifications  
 8 to the Department of Budget and Management for approval before funds may be  
 9 expended from the appropriation.

10 SECTION 10. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, no portion of the  
 11 proceeds of a loan or any of the matching funds provided for a project funded under  
 12 this Act may be used for the furtherance of sectarian religious instruction, or in  
 13 connection with the design, acquisition, construction, or equipping of any building  
 14 used or to be used as a place of sectarian religious worship or instruction, or in  
 15 connection with any program or department of divinity for any religious  
 16 denomination. Upon the request of the Board of Public Works, a recipient of the  
 17 proceeds of a loan under this Act shall submit evidence satisfactory to the Board that  
 18 none of the proceeds of the loan or any matching funds has been or is being used for  
 19 a purpose prohibited by this Act.

20 SECTION 11. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:

21 (a) the Comptroller may advance funds from any loan fund account to any  
 22 other loan fund account established pursuant to a General Obligation Loan Enabling  
 23 Act, under the authority of which general obligation bonds have been issued, for any  
 24 expenditure authorized by such Act.

25 (b) with the approval of the Board of Public Works, the Comptroller may  
 26 advance funds to any loan fund account established pursuant to a General Obligation  
 27 Loan Enabling Act, for which an approving legal opinion has been received by the  
 28 Board, for any expenditure authorized by the Act, provided that the next sale of  
 29 general obligation bonds shall include the issuance of bonds under the authority of  
 30 that Act in an amount at least equivalent to the amount of the funds so advanced.

31 SECTION 12. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the net new debt to be  
 32 authorized by legislation in fiscal year 2000 shall not exceed \$445,000,000, as  
 33 evidenced by the following:
