4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Motor Vehicle Administration to assess cumulative

- 5 points, subject to a certain limitation, against an individual who is convicted of
- 6 reckless driving in combination with certain other moving violations arising out
- 7 of the same incident; making stylistic changes; and generally relating to motor
- 8 vehicles and the points that may be assessed against an individual for certain
- 9 violations in combination with reckless driving.

2 (a) A person is guilty of reckless driving if [he] THE PERSON drives a motor 3 vehicle:

4 (1) In wanton or willful disregard for the safety of persons or property; or

5 (2) In a manner that indicates a wanton or willful disregard for the 6 safety of persons or property.

7 (b) A person is guilty of negligent driving if [he] THE PERSON drives a motor 8 vehicle in a careless or imprudent manner that endangers any property or the life or 9 person of any individual.

10 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 11 October 1, 1999.
