12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

16 (d) (1) Except as provided in [paragraph (2)] PARAGRAPHS (2) AND (3) of
17 this subsection, a person may not drive a vehicle with any sign, poster, card, sticker,
18 or other nontransparent material on the windshield, side wings, or side or rear
19 windows of the vehicle.
20 (2) This subsection does not apply to:

1 (i) Materials placed on the windshield or rear window, within a 7 2 inch square area in the lower corner, or on the side windows of the vehicle to the rear 3 of the driver, if the materials are placed so as not to interfere with the driver's clear 4 view of traffic;
5 (ii) Direction, destination, or termini signs on any passenger 6 common carrier motor vehicle; or
o common carrier motor venicle, or
7 (iii) Electronic toll collection tags placed in the windshield of a
8 vehicle in accordance with the regulations of the Maryland Transportation Authority.
9 (3) THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO EXEMPT
10 FROM THE PROVISIONS OF PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION MATERIALS PLACED
11 ON THE WINDSHIELD OF A VEHICLE IN COMPLIANCE WITH SECURITY MEASURES
12 REQUIRED BY A FEDERAL OR STATE GOVERNMENT AGENCY AND APPROVED BY THE
13 ADMINISTRATION.
SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 1999.
