5 (1) The applicant pays the application fee required by the Board under § 6 14-309 of this subtitle; and

7 (2) The applicant provides adequate evidence that the applicant meets 8 the qualifications otherwise required by this title.

9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 10 October 1, 1999.
