2 Extrajurisdictional Authority for Police Officers - Joint Operation

- 3 FOR the purpose of authorizing a police officer to make arrests outside the officer's
- 4 jurisdiction if a warrant has been issued against a person and the police officer
- 5 is participating in a joint operation that is created by an agreement between the
- 6 primary law enforcement officers and the arrest occurs or is initiated within one
- 7 of the participating jurisdictions; providing for certain rights to immunity,
- 8 exemptions, and employment under certain circumstances; and generally
- 9 relating to a police officer's authority to act outside of the officer's jurisdiction.

- 15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

17 Article 27 - Crimes and Punishments

- 19 (A) (1) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS
- 20 INDICATED.
- 21 (2) "POLICE OFFICER" HAS THE MEANING PROVIDED IN § 594B(G) OF
- 22 THIS ARTICLE.
- 23 (3) "PRIMARY LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER" MEANS:
- 24 (I) IN AN INCORPORATED MUNICIPALITY, THE CHIEF OF POLICE, IF
- 25 ANY, OR THE CHIEF'S DESIGNEE;

- 1 (II) IN A COUNTY THAT HAS A COUNTY POLICE DEPARTMENT, THE 2 CHIEF OF POLICE OR THE CHIEF'S DESIGNEE:
- 3 (III) IN A COUNTY WITHOUT A POLICE DEPARTMENT, THE SHERIFF 4 OR THE SHERIFF'S DESIGNEE;
- 5 (IV) IN BALTIMORE CITY, THE POLICE COMMISSIONER OR THE 6 POLICE COMMISSIONER'S DESIGNEE;
- 7 (V) ON ANY PROPERTY OWNED, LEASED, OPERATED BY, OR UNDER
- 8 THE CONTROL OF THE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES, THE SECRETARY OF
- 9 NATURAL RESOURCES OR THE SECRETARY'S DESIGNEE;
- 10 (VI) ON ANY PROPERTY OWNED, LEASED, OPERATED BY, OR UNDER
- 11 THE CONTROL OF THE MARYLAND TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY, THE MARYLAND
- 12 AVIATION ADMINISTRATION, OR THE MARYLAND PORT ADMINISTRATION, THE
- 13 RESPECTIVE CHIEF OF POLICE OR THE CHIEF'S DESIGNEE; OR
- 14 (VII) THE SECRETARY OF THE STATE POLICE.
- 15 (B) A POLICE OFFICER MAY ARREST A PERSON THROUGHOUT THE STATE 16 WITHOUT LIMITATIONS AS TO JURISDICTION IF:
- 17 (1) A WARRANT HAS BEEN ISSUED AGAINST THE PERSON;
- 18 (2) THE POLICE OFFICER IS PARTICIPATING IN A JOINT OPERATION
- 19 THAT HAS BEEN CREATED BY AN AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE PRIMARY LAW
- 20 ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS;
- 21 (3) THE ARREST OCCURS WITHIN ONE OF THE PARTICIPATING
- 22 JURISDICTIONS PURSUANT TO THE AGREEMENT IN PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS
- 23 SUBSECTION; AND
- 24 (4) THE POLICE OFFICER IS ACTING IN ACCORDANCE WITH
- 25 REGULATIONS ADOPTED BY THE POLICE OFFICER'S EMPLOYING AGENCY TO
- 26 IMPLEMENT THIS SECTION.
- 27 (C) (1) WHEN ACTING UNDER THE AUTHORITY GRANTED IN THIS SECTION,
- 28 A POLICE OFFICER SHALL HAVE ALL THE IMMUNITIES FROM LIABILITY AND
- 29 EXEMPTIONS AS THAT OF A STATE POLICE OFFICER IN ADDITION TO ANY OTHER
- 30 IMMUNITIES AND EXEMPTIONS TO WHICH THE POLICE OFFICER MAY OTHERWISE BE
- 31 ENTITLED.
- 32 (2) ANY POLICE OFFICER WHO USES THE AUTHORITY GRANTED IN THIS
- 33 SECTION SHALL AT ALL TIMES OR FOR ALL PURPOSES REMAIN AN EMPLOYEE OF THE
- 34 RESPECTIVE EMPLOYING AGENCY.
- 35 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take
- 36 effect July 1, 1999.
