1 2	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
3	Article - Transportation
4	8-605.
	(a) Along any State highway, the Administration may place signs, signals, or markers to inform the traveling public of directions, distances, danger, or other information.
10 11	(b) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, the Administration shall assume the full cost of installing and maintaining traffic signals required at the intersection of a State highway with any municipal street or highway or at any other place along a State highway that is within the limits of any municipal corporation.
	(2) This subsection does not apply where the traffic signal primarily will serve traffic generated by a private development, such as an apartment complex, shopping center, industrial plant, or drive-in theater.
16 17	(c) Signs, signals, and markers placed along any interstate highway shall conform to all applicable federal standards.
20	(d) (1) For the purpose of providing information to the driving public on the availability of gas, food, lodging, or camping, the Administration may place along State highways specific information or business signs, subject to the applicable federal standards.
22 23	(2) (i) The Administration shall adopt rules and regulations governing specific information or business signs.
	(ii) The rules and regulations shall conform to all applicable federal standards, and shall govern the type, lighting, size, number, and location of specific information or business signs.
27 28	(iii) The Administration shall consult with the Maryland Travel Council prior to drafting rules and regulations.
	(3) The business or attraction identified in a specific information or business sign shall pay for the full administrative and operational cost of procurement, installation, and maintenance of the sign.
	(4) The Department of Transportation shall report to the Governor and General Assembly by January, 1986 on the results of the program for specific information signs.
	(e) Any person who removes, damages, or defaces any sign, signal, or marker placed under this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction is subject to a fine not exceeding \$100.

- 2 (A) THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL ESTABLISH A ROAD SIGNAGE PILOT

- 9 (C) (1) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF THIS TITLE, THE
- 10 GOVERNING BODY OF A PARTICIPATING COUNTY, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE
- 11 DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND THE
- 12 ADMINISTRATION, MAY PLACE SPECIFIC INFORMATION OR BUSINESS SIGNS ALONG
- 13 STATE HIGHWAYS IN THE COUNTY FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROVIDING INFORMATION
- 14 TO THE DRIVING PUBLIC ON THE AVAILABILITY OF GAS, FOOD, LODGING, SHOPPING,
- 15 AND OTHER ATTRACTIONS IN NEARBY AREAS.
- 16 (2) ANY SIGN PLACED ALONG A HIGHWAY BY A PARTICIPATING COUNTY
- 17 UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL COMPLY WITH APPLICABLE FEDERAL STANDARDS.
- 18 (D) (1) IN CONSULTATION WITH THE ADMINISTRATION, THE GOVERNING
- 19 BODY OF A PARTICIPATING COUNTY SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS GOVERNING
- 20 SPECIFIC INFORMATION OR BUSINESS SIGNS.
- 21 (2) THE REGULATIONS ADOPTED UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL
- 22 CONFORM TO ALL APPLICABLE FEDERAL STANDARDS AND SHALL GOVERN THE

- 29 (E) ANY PERSON WHO REMOVES, DAMAGES, OR DEFACES ANY SIGN, SIGNAL,
- 30 OR MARKER PLACED UNDER THIS SECTION IS GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR AND ON
- 31 CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO A FINE NOT EXCEEDING \$100.
- 32 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the State Highway
- 33 Administration shall report to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2-1246 of the
- 34 State Government Article, the General Assembly by January 31, 2001 on the results
- 35 of the pilot program established under this Act, including an analysis of the impact
- 36 the placement of signs along State highways in Montgomery and Prince George's
- 37 Counties has had on economic development and highway safety.
- 38 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the State Highway
- 39 Administration, in consultation with the Department of Business and Economic
- 40 Development and the governing bodies of the counties participating in the Road

- 1 Signage Pilot Program shall make recommendations, as part of the report required
- 2 under Section 2 of this Act, on the future of the Road Signage Pilot Program.
- 3 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 4 October 1, 1999. It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the end of
- 5 September 30, 2001, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this
- 6 Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
