- 21 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 24 [J. When an unqualified volunteer is killed in the line of duty during the
- 25 course of service as a volunteer fireman or squadman after July 1, 1989, a death
- 26 benefit of five thousand dollars (\$5,000.) shall be paid to the unqualified volunteer's
- 27 designated beneficiary.]

- 1 J. WHEN AN UNQUALIFIED VOLUNTEER IS KILLED IN THE LINE OF DUTY
- 2 DURING THE COURSE OF SERVICE AS A MEMBER OF A FIRE, EMERGENCY MEDICAL
- 3 SERVICE, OR SPECIALIZED RESCUE UNIT OR DIES HAVING COMPLETED AT LEAST
- 4 ONE (1) YEAR OF LENGTH OF SERVICE AWARD PROGRAM QUALIFYING SERVICE AND
- 5 IS CARRIED ON CURRENT MEMBERSHIP ROSTERS AND DOES NOT QUALIFY FOR
- 6 DEATH BENEFITS AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION H OF THIS SECTION, A DEATH
- 7 BENEFIT OF FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$5,000.) SHALL BE PAID TO THE
- 8 UNQUALIFIED VOLUNTEER'S DESIGNATED BENEFICIARY.
- 9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take 10 effect October 1, 1999.
