26 27 28 29 30	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, there is a pilot program in Cecil County for licensed cosmetologists. Notwithstanding § 5-605 of the Business Occupations and Professions Article as enacted by this Act, under the pilot program, a licensed cosmetologist may perform cosmetology services in the exempted locations specified in § 5-605(b) of the Business Occupations and Professions Article as enacted by this Act, without having the services sponsored by a beauty salon that holds a beauty salon permit, and without the patron being a customer of the beauty salon. As part of this pilot program, a cosmetologist shall:

- SECTION 2. 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take 4
- 5 effect October 1, 1999. It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years, and at the end
- 6 of September 30, 2001, with no further action required by the General Assembly, 7 Section 2 of this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
