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## Department of Agriculture - Soil Conservation and Water Quality Plans -Use of Information

4 FOR the purpose of requiring the supervisors of a soil conservation district to provide

- 5 the Maryland Department of Agriculture and the Department of the
- 6 <u>Environment</u> with any information in a soil conservation and water quality plan
- 7 for certain purposes; authorizing the Department of Agriculture to use the
- 8 information for statistical purposes and to release the information to a certain
- 9 government agency the Department of the Environment for a law certain
- 10 <u>compliance or enforcement purpose; requiring the Department of Agriculture</u>
- 11 and the supervisors to maintain plan information in a manner that protects the
- 12 identity of the person for whom the plan was prepared; and generally relating to
- 13 information concerning soil conservation and water quality plans.

19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

20 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## Article - Agriculture

2 8-306.

3 (B) (1) THE SUPERVISOR SHALL MAINTAIN INFORMATION FROM A SOIL
4 CONSERVATION AND WATER QUALITY PLAN IN A MANNER THAT PROTECTS THE
5 IDENTITY OF THE PERSON FOR WHOM THE PLAN IS PREPARED. HOWEVER, THE
6 SUPERVISORS SHALL MAKE A SOIL CONSERVATION AND WATER QUALITY PLAN
7 AVAILABLE TO <u>THE DEPARTMENT OF THE ENVIRONMENT FOR ENFORCEMENT</u>
8 <u>ACTION UNDER § 4-413 OF THE ENVIRONMENT ARTICLE AND</u> THE MARYLAND
9 DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE WHICH MAY USE THE INFORMATION FOR
10 STATISTICAL PURPOSES.

11 (2) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL:

12 (I) MAINTAIN THE INFORMATION IN THE MANNER THAT 13 PROTECTS THE IDENTITY OF THE PERSON FOR WHOM THE PLAN IS PREPARED; AND

(II) MAKE ANY INFORMATION FROM A PLAN AVAILABLE TO THE
 MARYLAND DEPARTMENT OF THE ENVIRONMENT FOR THE PURPOSE OF WATER
 QUALITY PERMIT COMPLIANCE OR ENFORCEMENT ACCORDING TO TO SUPPORT THE
 DEVELOPMENT OF A COMPLIANCE OR ENFORCEMENT CASE FOR PURPOSES OF
 ADDRESSING AN EXISTING WATER QUALITY PROBLEM IN ACCORDANCE WITH
 PROCEDURES ESTABLISHED BETWEEN THE DEPARTMENTS AND THE STATE SOIL
 CONSERVATION COMMITTEE.

[(b)] (C) As a condition to extending any benefit of this title to any land not
owned or controlled by the State or any of its agencies, or to performing work on them,
the supervisors may require contributions in money, services, materials, or otherwise
to any operations conferring benefits, and may require the land occupier to enter into
and perform agreements or covenants concerning the permanent use of the land as
tends to prevent or control erosion.

27 [(c)] (D) The supervisors of two or more districts may cooperate with one 28 another in the exercise of any powers conferred by this title.

[(d)] (E) No provision relating to acquisition, operation, or disposition of
property by other public bodies is applicable to a district, unless the provision
specifically so states.
