A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Estates and Trusts - Reinstatement of Personal Representative**

3 FOR the purpose of providing for the reinstatement of a personal representative on a
4 dismissal or withdrawal of a request for judicial probate; providing for the
5 application of this Act; and generally relating to the reinstatement of a personal
6 representative on a dismissal or withdrawal of a request for judicial probate.

12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14 **Article - Estates and Trusts**

15 6-307.

16 (a) (1) The appointment of a personal representative who has been
17 appointed by administrative probate is terminated by a timely request for judicial
18 probate.

19 (2) The validity of an act performed by [him] THE PERSON as personal
20 representative is not affected by this termination.

21 (b) Subject to an order in the proceeding for judicial probate, a personal
22 representative appointed previously has the powers and duties of a special
23 administrator until the appointment of a personal representative in the judicial
24 probate proceeding.

25 (c) A person, whose appointment as a personal representative is terminated
26 by a request for judicial probate, may be reappointed.

1 (D) THE APPOINTMENT OF A PERSONAL REPRESENTATIVE IS REINSTATED ON
2 A DISMISSAL OR WITHDRAWAL OF A REQUEST FOR JUDICIAL PROBATE.

3 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall be
4 construed only prospectively and may not be applied or interpreted to have any effect
5 on or application to a dismissal or withdrawal of a request for judicial probate that
6 occurs before the effective date of this Act.

7 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
8 October 1, 1999.
