1 AN ACT concerning

2 Homeowners Associations - Family Day Care Homes

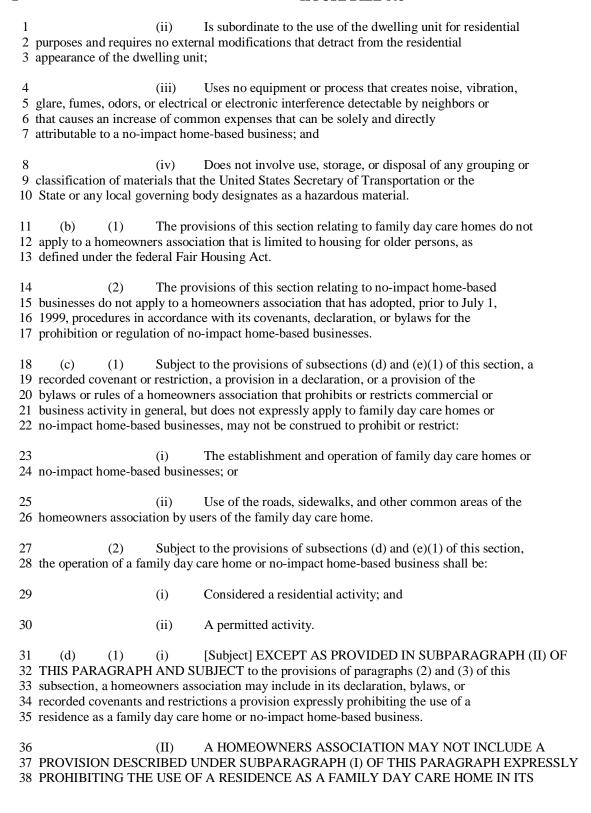
- 3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting a homeowners association from prohibiting the use of
- a residence as a family day care home until the lot owners, other than the 4
- 5 developer, have a certain percentage of the votes in the homeowners association;
- specifying that the approval of certain provisions expressly prohibiting the use 6
- of a residence as a family day care home or no-impact home-based business by 7
- 8 a simple majority of the total eligible voters does not include the developer;
- 9 repealing a provision of law that regulates a certain number of family day care
- 10 homes operating in the homeowners association; and generally relating to
- family day care homes and homeowners associations. 11

- 17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

19 **Article - Real Property**

20 11B-111.1.

- 21 In this section, the following words have the meanings indicated. (a) (1)
- 22 (2) "Day care provider" means the adult who has primary responsibility
- 23 for the operation of a family day care home.
- 24 (3) "Family day care home" means a unit registered under Title 5,
- 25 Subtitle 5 of the Family Law Article.
- 26 (4) "No-impact home-based business" means a business that:
- 27 (i) Is consistent with the residential character of the dwelling unit;

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1 DECLARATION, BYLAWS, OR RECORDED COVENANTS AND RESTRICTIONS UNTIL THE 2 LOT OWNERS, OTHER THAN THE DEVELOPER, HAVE 90% OF THE VOTES IN THE 3 HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATION. 4 A provision described under subparagraph (i) of this [(ii)] (III)5 paragraph expressly prohibiting the use of a residence as a family day care home or 6 no-impact home-based business shall apply to an existing family day care home or 7 no-impact home-based business in the homeowners association. 8 A provision described under paragraph (1)(i) of this subsection 9 expressly prohibiting the use of a residence as a family day care home or no-impact 10 home-based business may not be enforced unless it is approved by a simple majority 11 of the total eligible voters of the homeowners association, NOT INCLUDING THE 12 DEVELOPER, under the voting procedures contained in the declaration or bylaws of 13 the homeowners association. 14 (3) If a homeowners association includes in its declaration, bylaws, or 15 recorded covenants and restrictions a provision prohibiting the use of a residence as a 16 family day care home or no-impact home-based business, it shall also include a provision stating that the prohibition may be eliminated and family day care homes 18 or no-impact home-based businesses may be approved by a simple majority of the 19 total eligible voters of the homeowners association under the voting procedures 20 contained in the declaration or bylaws of the homeowners association. 21 If a homeowners association includes in its declaration, bylaws, or 22 recorded covenants and restrictions a provision expressly prohibiting the use of a 23 residence as a family day care home or no-impact home-based business, the 24 prohibition may be eliminated and family day care or no-impact home-based 25 business activities may be permitted by the approval of a simple majority of the total 26 eligible voters of the homeowners association under the voting procedures contained 27 in the declaration or bylaws of the homeowners association. 28 A homeowners association may include in its declaration, bylaws, rules, or 29 recorded covenants and restrictions a provision that: 30 [Regulates the number or percentage of family day care homes (1) 31 operating in the homeowners association, provided that the percentage of family day 32 care homes permitted may not be less than 7.5 percent of the total residences of the 33 homeowners association; 34 Requires day care providers to pay on a pro rata basis based on the 35 total number of family day care homes operating in the homeowners association any 36 increase in insurance costs of the homeowners association that are solely and directly 37 attributable to the operation of family day care homes in the homeowners association; 38 and 39 Imposes a fee for use of common areas in a reasonable amount [(3)](2) 40 not to exceed \$50 per year on each family day care home or no-impact home-based 41 business which is registered and operating in the homeowners association.

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1 (f) (1) If the homeowners association regulates the number or percentage of 2 family day care homes under subsection (e)(1) of this section, in order to assure 3 compliance with this regulation, the homeowners association may require residents to 4 notify the homeowners association before opening a family day care home. 5 The homeowners association may require residents to notify the (2) 6 homeowners association before opening a no-impact home-based business. 7 A day care provider in a homeowners association: (g) (1) 8 Shall obtain the liability insurance described under §§ 19-106 9 and 19-202 of the Insurance Article in at least the minimum amount described under 10 that statute; and 11 (ii) May not operate without the liability insurance described under 12 item (i) of this paragraph. 13 A homeowners association may not require a day care provider to 14 obtain insurance in an amount greater than the minimum amount required under 15 paragraph (1) of this subsection. 16 A homeowners association may restrict or prohibit a no-impact 17 home-based business in any common areas. 18 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 19 October 1, 1999.
