- 16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 18 Article Agriculture
- 19 10-601.
- 20 (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.
- 21 (c) "Farm product" means any agricultural, horticultural, vegetable, or fruit
- 22 product of the soil, including livestock, meats, marine food products, poultry, eggs,
- 23 dairy products, wool, hides, feathers, nuts, honey, and every product of farm, forest,
- 24 orchard, garden or water, but does not include canned, frozen, dried, or pickled
- 25 products.

1 Article - Transportation

- 3 (a) The State Highway Administration may conduct appropriate studies to
- 4 determine whether the safety and general welfare of a residential community are
- 5 threatened by noise, vibration, or incidence of truck traffic on any State highway. In
- 6 determining whether or not to conduct such a study, the Administration shall consider
- 7 the number of complaints about truck traffic received, if any, from residents of an
- 8 area.
- 9 (b) If the State Highway Administration determines that a threat exists and
- 10 that the safety and general welfare of the residential community would be promoted
- 11 by the adoption of restrictions on the use of the State highway by trucks, the
- 12 Administration may establish routes, speed limits, time restrictions, weight
- 13 restrictions, or other measures with respect to truck traffic on the State highway,
- 14 which will minimize the adverse effects of that traffic on the residential area or cause
- 15 that traffic to avoid the residential area entirely.
- 16 (c) Under this section, truck traffic may be prohibited entirely on any State
- 17 highway or part of a State highway, if an adequately functional alternate route is
- 18 available to carry the truck traffic, taking into consideration the amount of additional
- 19 fuel that would be required over the alternate route and the economic impact on the
- 20 citizens of this State caused by the alternate route.
- 21 (d) The provisions of this section:
- 22 (1) Do not apply to any Class E (truck) vehicles of 10,000 pounds or less
- 23 gross vehicle weight; [and]
- 24 (2) Do not preclude the making of local deliveries of supplies or services
- 25 in any residential communities; AND
- 26 (3) DO NOT APPLY TO ANY TRUCK CARRYING FARM PRODUCTS AS
- 27 DEFINED UNDER § 10-601 OF THE AGRICULTURE ARTICLE.
- 28 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 29 October 1, 1999.
