BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 20 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: **Article - Labor and Employment** 21 22 9-503.

12 13	(ii) To be eligible for the presumption under this subsection, a Prince George's County deputy sheriff OR CORRECTIONAL OFFICER, as a condition of employment, shall submit to a medical examination to determine any heart disease or hypertension condition existing prior to the individual's employment as a Prince George's County deputy sheriff OR CORRECTIONAL OFFICER.	
17 18 19 20 21	(d) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, any paid fire fighter, paid fire fighting instructor, sworn member of the Office of the State Fire Marshal, paid police officer, [or any] deputy sheriff of Montgomery [County] COUNTY, or Prince George's County DEPUTY SHERIFF OR CORRECTIONAL OFFICE who is eligible for benefits under subsection (a), (b), or (c) of this section shall receive the benefits in addition to any benefits that the individual is entitled to receive under the retirement system in which the individual was a participant at the time of the claim. 	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, notwithstanding the provisions of § 9-503(b)(2) of the Labor and Employment Article, a Prince George's County correctional officer who is employed on or before September 30, 1999:	
33 34	(1) As a condition of continued employment shall provide to the Prince George's County Director of the Department of Correctional Services on or before December 31, 1999, a copy of a medical report disclosing and describing any existing heart disease or hypertension from which the correctional officer may be suffering; and	
38 39	(2) Is entitled to the presumption under § 9-503(b) of the Labor and Employment Article only to the extent that the individual suffers from heart disease or hypertension that is more severe than the individual's heart disease or hypertension condition existing as of the date of the medical report provided under paragraph (1) of this section.	

- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 2 October 1, 1999.
